

As I start this term in my new role as Acting Principal, I am excited and privileged to have such an important part to play in your child's development and ensuring they are confident and challenged to achieve their full potential.

At Kilmore Primary School we value your support and want to work together to achieve the best outcomes for your child. ### **Staffing Update**

This term we welcome Miss. Simone Cocks and Mrs. Andrea Lewis to our teaching staff. Simone has replaced Mrs. Bassett in 2B while she is on Family Leave. Mrs. Dixon will be on leave this term and Mrs. Lewis will be in the art room two days per week.

### New smoking bans to apply on school grounds and at school entrances

From 13 April 2015, smoking will be banned within four metres of an entrance to all primary and secondary schools in Victoria, and within the school grounds, under an amendment to the Tobacco Act 1987. A similar ban applying to the entrances and grounds of Victorian childcare centres and kindergartens will be introduced at the same time. While smoking was banned on the grounds of all Victorian Government schools by the Minister for Education in 2009 via a Ministerial Ban Order, the new bans are enshrined in legislation and will also apply to Catholic and independent schools in Victoria, thereby ensuring a consistent approach across the government and non-government sectors. It is a legislative requirement that each school installs suitable 'No smoking' signs at all entrances to the school premises. These are currently on order and will be installed on arrival.

#### Highlights from the end of Term 1

Last term finished on a really positive note at Kilmore Primary School with some fantastic events occurring after our last newsletter was published. What an amazing job the grade 5/6's did with their Notable Australian's projects. The high quality work and knowledge the students presented was impressive. Thank you to the fantastic support shown by parents, grandparents and friends who came to see the work on display. The grade 1 students learnt first-hand about the past through the visit of grandparents and special friends who came to school to share memories of their childhood and how things have changed, and the grade 2 unit went on a very exciting and informative walk through Kilmore visiting a number of historic buildings in our town to bring to life their history unit of study. Thank you to the teachers for organising such engaging activities and to all our families for support these events in so many different ways.

We look forward to many more opportunities in Term 2 to invite you to join us in our learning journey and encourage you to be part of our school community.

#### Every Day Counts - School Attendance

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are things we can do together to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.
- Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, *Every Day Counts*. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher early as possible.

From 1 March 2014, new laws will mean that parents can be fined for not sending students to school without an acceptable reason.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

# Kilmore Primary School Portal

Our school has undertaken a new initiative, the Student and Parent Portal, to provide both parents and students discreet information about each student\'s progress in our school. Staff began using this system halfway through last year, and have continued to map student progress using this program.

As we progress with this initiative, I am confident that the Student/Parent Portal will become more and more significant in your day to day management of your child\'s enrolment at our school.

There will be letters going home addressed to each family, detailing:

- The address of the site
- How to log into the portal
- Specific access keys for each family

There will be an information night held on Tuesday the 21<sup>st</sup> of April at 6.30pm for parents who would like to log onto the system and learn more about how to use it. There will also be an information afternoon for parents who find it easier to attend during the day on Wednesday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April at 2.00pm.

**Please note**: the portal is currently being used by students in Grades 3-6. Students in Grades 1 and 2, have logged in and used the portal, however they will spend Semester 2 working on it during ICT lessons. Foundation students will also begin working on the Portal later in the year when their ICT skills develop further.




# Fundraising 2015 Term 2

# Balancing Love & Discipline A Parenting Program

The program is facilitated by **Marc des Landes** from **Familycare** in Seymour.

Marc has conducted numerous parenting workshops and worked with adults and children in a counselling capacity for many years. Marc is highly regarded and has a terrific reputation in this area. The course is **open to all parents** and has an emphasis on the important role of the father in **establishing sound relationships** with their children.

It is very common these days for fathers to be taking a much more active role in family life. Mothers are also finding that there are more demands on their time from a financial point of view. Fathers who find themselves more involved in the parenting part of family life may also find themselves **wishing** for more options for dealing with the day to day issues that arise in the home.

This course is suitable for <u>all</u> parents who would like to meet with others to explore ways to increase their options in dealing with the various issues that parents experience while supporting and nurturing their partners and children of all ages.

Parents may attend as a couple, share attendance by alternating nights, or attend alone. If you miss one or two nights, notes from previous sessions will help you catch up.

Some of the topics that have been helpful in previous groups include:

- Good communication
- Teaching life skills
- Issues of discipline
- What is normal for kids?
- Confronting unacceptable behaviour
- How to help your child when they are anxious, angry or upset

"Discovering that others are experiencing problems almost identical to your own somehow seems to lighten your load".

In December 2014 "S.S." said; "Clear, well organised, the eight week setting enabled us to learn & practice then reflect on what we had learned".

"J.R" said; "The course was really helpful, can't think of any improvement aside from -more people should do it".

"L.D." said; "Initially came to support partner, but gained a lot of valuable information".

"R.P." said; "It has helped me with being a less angry and a much calmer parent. It helped us as a couple identifying some "holes" that need filling and given us the strategies that we need to fill them".
