From the Principal's Desk... Welcome to Week 7- Term 2

I would like to start this week's catch up with a huge thank you to our student leaders who attended the school open morning Saturday. The amazing team of confident, well presented and articulate young students met and greeted the visitors to our school and conducted insightful and entertaining tours showcasing our school. I felt very proud of these children and the school as we walked through the facilities and described the variety of opportunities available for our students. We were pleased with the number of new families who attended and were encouraged by the feedback they gave. I would like to thank Julie McCarthy, Jennene Cooney, Carolyn Crowther, Brendan Thompson, Kristy Brooks, Tracey Crane and David McBean who attended the event and represented our school so well.

On Monday, Julie McCarthy and I had the pleasure of spending the day at St Pats Primary School and joining in a special program they had running as part of their engagement community work. Principal, Michael Bourne, extended an invitation to us to join in the program which was run by visiting guest George Otero. George Otero is an American educator who is renowned for his work in community engagement in schools. He is a high profile expert in his field and it was an amazing opportunity for Julie and I to be able to interact with him as he conducted a learning walk through the school. The day included members of the St Pat's staff, some parents and their student leadership team. Assumption College was also represented. As part of the program we visited several classes and then engaged in reflective conversations about what was observed. I felt extremely excited about

the experience of the day and more importantly the building of relationships between the education hubs in our Kilmore community. I believe the bonds we are building and sharing of practice that is happening will have enormous potential to impact positively on the experiences of all children, families and extended community of Kilmore. Sincere thanks to Michael and his staff for the warm and welcoming manner in which we were treated and the wonderful learning opportunity we experienced.

Many families will be receiving information about the 3/4 and 5/6 camps that have now been finalised. We have tried to get the information out as early as possible in recognition of the cost of these activities. If you have not registered for the portal yet, or you have not entered your Unique Family Code, please see the letter that was sent home this Term and the email sent earlier this week, to finalise this process.





5G Scientists!




We have had a lot of fun so far in our inquiry unit for this term down in 56. We have been studying chemical science which means that we get to do lots of fun experiments to understand the difference between solids,

Numeracy News



This week students and teachers have had an enjoyable and busy **time** learning all about clocks, reading and writing different times, calculating the duration of events, exploring time zones around the world and solving all sorts of problems involving time.

Family Fun

What's the time? How long until.....? These are common questions which are asked many times each day. They are the perfect opportunity to practise working with times in a real life setting to solve real life problems.

Things to try at home this week:

Foundation: Say the days of the week in order. Talk about the events that happen on particular days. For example, Spanish on Tuesday, swimming on Thursday.

Grade 1: Practise telling the time to the half hour using analogue and digital clocks.

Grade 2: Tell the time to the quarter hour using 'quarter past' and 'quarter to'. Practise using analogue and digital clocks.

Grade 3: Aim to tell the time to the minute on analogue and digital clocks.

Grade 4: Make up some time problems and solve them. For example, 'If it takes me 30 minutes to walk to footy training and training starts at 4:10pm, what time should I leave home?'

Grade 5: Find examples of 24 hour times at home. Perhaps they will be on the oven? Microwave? TV? Convert them to 12 hour time.




