What an amazing start to 2019 we have had. The children are a credit to us all. They have settled back into the routines of school and displayed our high expectations and enthusiasm for learning from the moment the first bell rang. I would like to thank our staff who did an incredible job preparing for the start of the year. It was clear that hours of work went into the preparation for the children's start with many teams meeting regularly over the Christmas break. I would like to welcome all of our Foundation students who have settled in so well. Welcome to the new families and families who have other children at the school. We have several new staff who will introduce themselves through the newsletter over the coming weeks. So far we could not have asked for a better team.

There has been a change to the specialist program this year. We are no longer providing Spanish as a language. This year we will investigate the provision of another language and seek community input to this. Sourcing and retaining a fully qualified Spanish Teacher has proven very difficult in the past, hence the call to review the program. I am delighted however, to announce that we will be running Perceptual Motor Program (PMP) for Foundation, Performing Arts for Grade 1-2, Music for Years 3 – 5 and an electives program for Grade 6 as part of their transition program for secondary school. Anna Sloane will run the PMP program, Paul Wookey joins us as the Music Teacher and Caitlin Pappin will run the Electives Program and Performing Arts. More information about these programs will be provided to the relevant grades. This is a very exciting initiative for the year.

I would like to give a huge thank you to Tracey and Tina for their work in preparing the grounds for the start of the year. The planters have been refreshed and new ones placed outside the new portables. We also had seating installed around the oval which looks amazing! Thank you to all involved.

I am very excited about this year which promises to be filled with wonderful learning opportunities for all our students. As always, remember that open and honest communication is key to helping our children. If you have any concerns please talk to us before getting anxious or upset. Don't forget that we also love it when you talk to us about the positives!

Accident Insurance, Ambulance Cover and Private Property

We would like to remind families that the Department of Education and Training does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance / ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transportation.

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department of Education and Training does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage. This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. As the Department of Education and Training does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property, students should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.

Parents or guardians can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers if they wish.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

Applications for Conveyance Allowance for Term 1 2019 are now open. Application forms are available from the school office. Please ensure that the completed form is returned to school by **Friday 15th March 2019**.

Eligibility Criteria

The eligibility criteria varies depending on the type of school attended and where it is located.

Students attending a government or non-government school must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended
- be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

Note: Eligibility is assessed when the school completes your child's application on the Student Conveyance Allowance System (SCAS). If approved, the allowance payable is based on the one way distance to make the journey to and from school. 

You can join in by:


