

From the Principal's Desk...

Welcome to Week 4- Term 3

We had a very productive school council meeting last night with lots of things on the agenda. The education Committee finalised the draft of our new Book Work Policy and we discussed the uniform Policy as well.

The Uniform Policy:

We had one parent and two classrooms respond to our call for feedback on the uniform policy. In light of this feedback and the discussion at School Council last night the uniform policy will remain unchanged. There was one question raised and that was whether there is a need to have two colour choices for polo shirts. Currently the uniform allows for either white or pale blue. Very few students wear the white and we are thinking that the practicality of the colour for young children is the main reason for this. We have decided to run a vote on whether we continue to have both colours or phase the white polo out. If we phase the white polo out it would be done over the next few years. White polos would stay until stock in the uniform shop ran out and students no longer had them. No-one would be left with white polos and not be able to use them. SRC representatives from each class will conduct a survey in their class. Parents we are asking for you to vote via email or in writing forwarded to the school. Voting will ending **September 2nd** and a decision made at School Council on **September 6th**.

Please support the school by ensuring that children attend with full uniform each day. Spare uniforms will be used for those children who are out of uniform. Please remember that **hoodies have never been a part of our uniform policy and are not to be worn**. If you have plain navy hoodies you might consider taking the hood off, otherwise the hood will have to be tucked in. Some children have taken to wearing them under their uniform with the hood hanging out. It is the hood that is dangerous as it can get hooked on equipment or other students and cause a neck or throat injury. They also restrict vision and can create collision risks.

Navy blue skorts (skirt/shorts combined)
Sky blue or white polo shirt
Navy blue school windcheater or polar fleece jacket
Navy blue wide brimmed or legionnaires school hat
Navy blue beanie (optional – term two/three)
Grade six jumper

Bovs Uniform:

Navy blue school shorts, cargo pants, track pants Sky blue or white polo shirt Navy blue school windcheater or polar fleece jacket Navy blue wide brimmed or legionnaires school hat Navy blue beanie (optional – term two/three) Grade six jumper

The wearing of School Uniform is compulsory; exemptions can be given on the grounds of religious beliefs, special needs and welfare.

If you are having financial difficulties in regards to the provision of a uniform for your child please make an appointment to see me so that we can assist.

It only seems like yesterday that I was typing last week's 'Asha's Adventures' for the newsletter. Time certainly flies when you're having fun.



Opening Ceremony and Dress Up Day

Clothes: Students can wear clothes that represent their countries uniforms or colours from their countries flag

There will be a 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th continent on the day. There will also be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd country on the sports day.





Eyeball Pancakes

By the end of this you will be able to make eyeball pancakes. Just follow the steps.

Ingredients

- 1. 2 Eyeballs
- 2. 1 cup of milk
- 3. 2 cups of flour
- 4. 200 gm Butter
- 5. 2 Eggs

Materials

- 1. Pan
- 2. Spoon
- 3. Big bowl
- 4.Stove
- 5. Plates
- 6. Knife and Forks

Step by Step Instructions

- 1. Get out the ingredients/materials.
- 2. Put the milk and flour into the big bowl. Now start mixing.
- 3. Melt the butter in the microwave for two minutes and then put it in the big bowl. Keep mixing.
- 4. Next you need to put two eggs into the big bowl and mix it all together.
- 5. Pour the mixture into a hot pan. When bubbles form, flip over to cook on the other side.
- 6. Now you need to add the eyeballs.
- 7. Take the eyeball pancakes out of the pan and put them on a plate.


