Welcome to Week 6, Term 1.

The Term is flying by and the 1<sup>st</sup> of March brought with it the official start of Autumn, which is very welcome after our long, hot summer. We are already experiencing some cooler mornings and days, so please ensure that your children have a warm top or jumper in their bags, just in case. (You never know, we might just get some rain too!)

**CFA Red Balloon Thank You Day**

What an amazing sight it was last Friday to see our fabulous tribute of Red Balloons and Thank You Banners for our wonderful CFA volunteers on our fence on Lancefield Road. I felt so proud of our students and the community spirit that was shown by everyone on that day, and would especially like to thank the parents and teachers who organised this for us.

The Kilmore CFA have asked that we take care of our own people who had losses during the fires, before handing on any of the donations to them – this is amazing act of generosity. If you, or someone you know is doing it hard after the fires, and needs some funds for new fencing or the like, please come and see me. We have a few hundred dollars that might make all the difference to someone in need. If no-one comes forward the funds will go to the CFA.

The CFA also asked me to acknowledge all of the other emergency support personnel that assisted during the fires, SES, Ambulance, Police, other volunteers, etc., because without them, their job would have been so much harder.

**Every Day Counts – School Attendance**

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

### Every Day Counts – School Attendance cont.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are things we can do together to ensure they don't fall behind:

Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.

Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

From 1 March 2014, new laws will mean that parents can be fined for not sending students to school without an acceptable reason.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher or a member of our Leadership Team know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

### Uniform Supplies

We have now completed the changeover to our new Uniform Supplier, who is 'All Things Uniform' in Broadford. You will still be able to buy uniforms or place Uniform orders at our Uniform Shop on Friday afternoons between 2.10pm and 3.30pm. You can also get a Uniform List from us and ring the supplier directly with your order, or you can visit them at their Broadford shop.

Last night at the Prep Information Evening I spoke to our Prep parents about opening up a Bendigo Bank Account for their children. This will run in the same way as our other student banking. ### CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

To be eligible for conveyance allowance:

- Must be school age (between 5-18 years old)
- Must attend an eligible school within the conveyance area
- Must live 4.8km or more from the school by the shortest practical route

A private car or private bus conveyance allowance is not available if the journey could have been made using a Department-funded school bus or public transport service.

Reimbursement is calculated on the basis of the one-way distance travelled.

Distance is measured by the shortest practicable route between the student's place of residence and their school.

The residential address should be based on the Rural Road Numbering System. Mailbox and PO Box addresses cannot be used. You can use Bing Maps as a reference:

# EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

## Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

## Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

## What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

**Sickness** – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

**"Day off"** – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

**Truancy** – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.

- Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

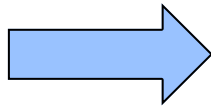

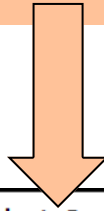

### **Literacy Alert** **Oxford Word List**

*Dear Parents/Guardians,*

*All students at K.P.S. from Foundation Level (Preps) to Grade 6 use the Oxford Word List as part of their Reading, Writing and Spelling Program. The list consists of 307 of the most used words in Literacy from research that analysed 1000 writing samples of students from schools within Australia. The research showed that these words were the most commonly used in students' writing in the first three years of their schooling.*

*At KPS, students are monitored and regularly assessed on these words. The words have been grouped into the following colours to show those used most frequently starting at the first colour;*

*red, orange, yellow, green, blue, cream, brown, pink, lemon, lime, gold, violet, sky blue, black, ginger and white words.*

*Students are acknowledged for their efforts and receive encouragement, praise and awards when they are able to read and spell the words accurately and include these words in their writing. They are assessed by their teachers during individual conferencing sessions as part of our Literacy program.*

*Students will be provided with groups of coloured words in their take home reader folders so that they can practice with you at home. Other spelling words come from on-going assessment conducted in the classroom, the KPS spelling document and from the students own writing.*
