One activity was a self guided farm tour, where we were given food and we fed and patted chickens, sheep, lambs, alpacas, goats and kids! Alpaca fleece is so soft! We also saw Shetland ponies and guinea pigs.



The second activity with Karina was creating a creature that had a job to help the environment, using materials like old bottles, lids, foam and soap dispenser pumps.

The third activity with Michael was learning about the different coloured bins we have at home and sorting rubbish into the right bin. We had a relay race to sort the rubbish in the correct colours! We also learnt that cow farts aren't good for the environment because of the methane gas!

Although it was a warm day and most of us were exhausted at the end of the day, we had a great day!

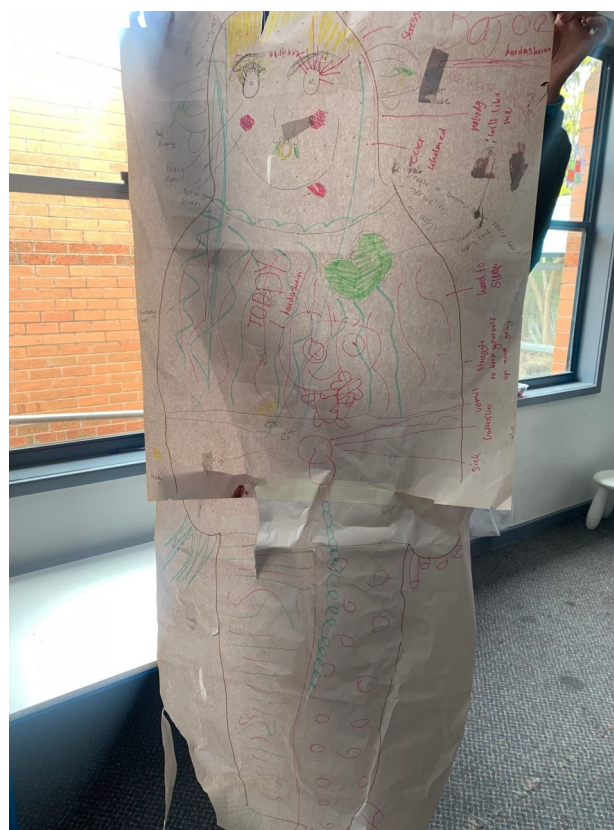
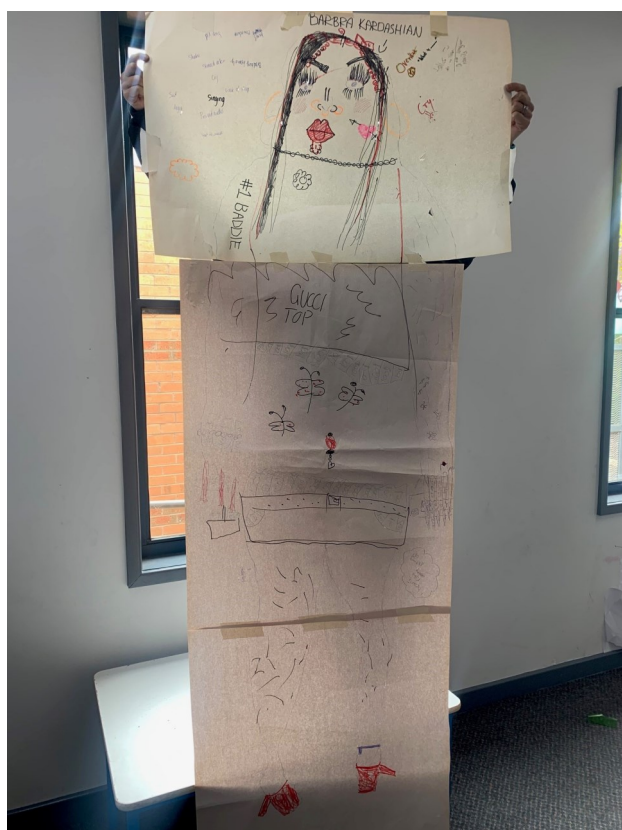
Jed

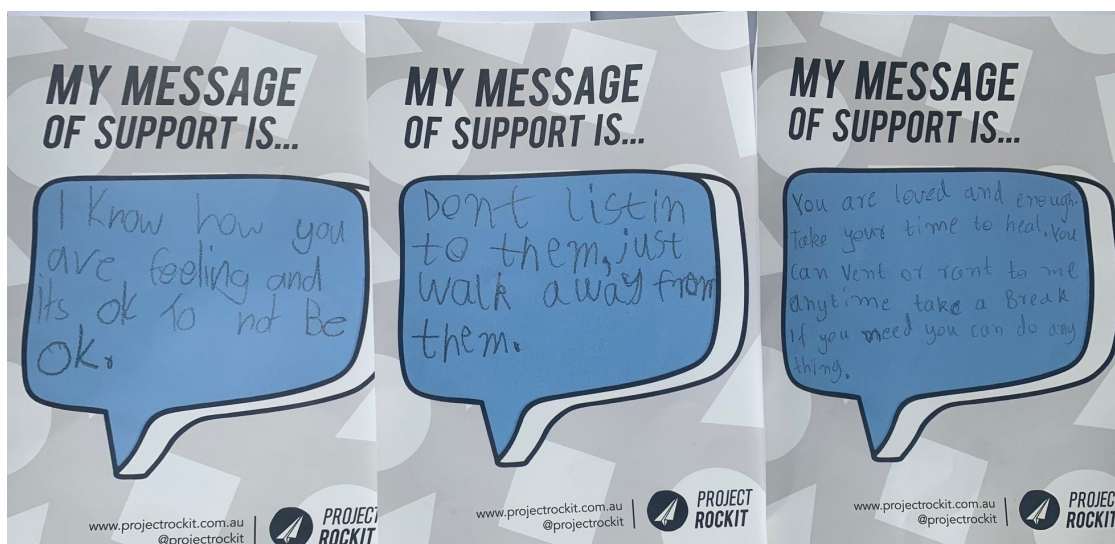
The grade 5 experience

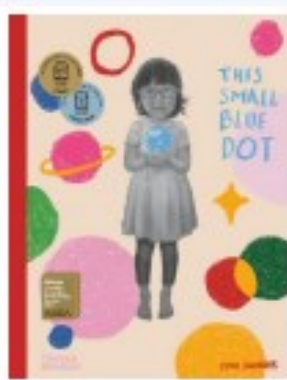

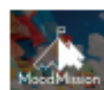
